Matthew 3:13-17 May 06, 2018

- 1. The Resistance of John: Vs.13-14
 - A. John's baptism was for sinners who were <u>conscious</u> of their sin.
 - B. Jesus needed no repentance of sin therefore John felt <u>unworthy</u> of this opportunity.
 - C. How often do we feel unworthy when Jesus asks us to serve?
- 2. The Readiness of Jesus: Vs.15
 - A. Quote: The success of any undertaking is determined by the wisdom with which the moment to embark upon it is chosen. William Barclay
 - B. By identifying Himself with those whom He came to <u>redeem</u>, Jesus inaugurated His public ministry as the Messiah.
 - C. By His baptism Jesus completely identified Himself with humanity's sin and failure.
- 3. The Regard of the Father: Vs.16-17
 - A. The Holy Spirit came upon Jesus to equip Him for the work that lay ahead.
 - B. This word from the Father must have greatly <u>encouraged</u> Jesus at the very beginning of His earthly ministry. It should encourage us to be <u>obedient</u> to the Father's will for our lives (John 8:29).
 - C. The tense of the Greek verb (well pleased) means that God has always been and always will be "well pleased" with His Son. Can God <u>look</u> at us and say that He is "well pleased"?
